Established in the 1900s, **Raffles Beijing Hotel** witnessed many of the city's significant social and political events and its commanding French-Orient colonnade façade has long stood as an icon of Beijing's historical heritage. It enjoys the most prestigious address, at the crossroads of Chang An Avenue and shopping district of Wangfujing, a heartbeat away from the historic Forbidden City and Tiananmen Square. Faithfully restored, it reopened on June 27, 2006 featuring 171 tastefully appointed rooms, four distinctive restaurants and bars, and five well-equipped banquet venues and a lofty lobby adorned with a procession of graceful arches.
