RICH HISTORY

Declared a New York City landmark in 1988, The St. Regis New York stands as a testament to John Jacob Astor's vision of creating the finest in hospitality and service. Sparing no expense, Astor spent over \$5.5 million on marble floors, crystal chandeliers, antique tapestries, oriental rugs and Louis XV furniture to create the iconic 18-story world-class hotel, which quickly became the premier stomping ground for Manhattan's socialites, revered societal figures and the elite group, "Astor 400." After Astor's death during the sinking of the Titanic in 1912, the hotel changed hands several times until Sheraton purchased an interest in 1966. The St. Regis New York closed its doors in 1988 for the first time for a complete restoration, and after refurbishment it has been welcoming guests from all over the world and immersing them in an atmosphere of true luxury.

Under the direction of world-renowned interior designer Sills Huniford, the iconic St. Regis New York recently received a total redesign of its guest rooms.

ADOUR: Alain Ducasse, internationally-acclaimed chef, recently introduced a new signature restaurant at The St. Regis New York that is delighting guests with its delicious contemporary French cuisine and accompanying wine pairings. Designed by David Rockwell of architecture firm Rockwell Group, the wine-inspired décor pairs harmoniously with the wine-focused menu and interactive bar.

KING COLE BAR: Named for Maxfield Parrish’s masterpiece—the Old King Cole mural which was restored to its original glory and now adorns the wall behind the bar—the King Cole Bar remains a legendary society club. Its most prized cocktail, the Red Snapper (now commonly known as a Bloody Mary), was invented by St. Regis bartender Fernand Petiot and celebrates its 75th anniversary this year.

ASTOR COURT: A refined bistro that serves breakfast, lunch and dinner, Astor Court offers a serene and elegant dining experience. Exceptional cuisine and excellent service are hallmarks of the hotel’s staple restaurant and the varied menu includes international dishes as well as standard American fare to appeal to every guest’s palate.
